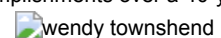

When was the last time you read the PRSA Ethics Code?

I've been a member of PRSA for 15  years but the last time I read the Ethics Code was, er, well, let's just say it was awhile ago. As your new Ethics Officer for 2010, I'd like to go back to basics.

PRSA revamped its Ethics Code in 2000. The emphasis on enforcement is gone, but PRSA retains the right to bar from membership or expel from the Society people who are sanctioned by a government agency or convicted in a court of law of an action that is in violation of the code.

So the code is important. In fact, PRSA believes it's the most important obligation of its membership.

The code itself is refreshingly short. It starts with a Statement of Professional Values which include advocacy, honesty, expertise, independence, loyalty and fairness. These values are the fundamental beliefs that guide our every day work. Not only are they integral to the code, PRSA believes they are vital to the integrity of the profession as a whole.

Next month we'll look at the provisions that make up the bulk of the code. Meanwhile, check out the wealth of resources on ethics at www.prsa.org/ethics.
