At the annual meeting of the Delegate Assembly in Washington, DC, in October, the requirement that national PRSA board members must hold APR accreditation was maintained.

In a September survey of members of the Puget Sound Chapter, 62 percent agreed that the APR credential should be required for national board service in PRSA.
