APR prep course – fall 2010

The fall 2010 preparation course for APR accreditation has been scheduled. Classes will be held in the South Sound, at Good Samaritan Hospital in Puyallup, from Saturday, October 30, through Thursday, November 18.

Seven sessions will cover all the major topics on the computer-based APR exam and essential recommendations for successfully passing the readiness review.

To enroll, you must be a PRSA member and must apply to National to pursue accreditation.

Note that National is offering a \$110 rebate to all applicants who complete the computer-based exam. The \$90 fee for the fall chapter APR course covers materials, and will be refunded to you when you pass the APR exam. The fee does not cover the text, "Effective Public Relations," 10th ed., by Cutlip, Center, and Broom, which you need to



obtain on your own. Copies are readily available, new and used; recent earlier editions will also suffice in place of the 10th.

Registration is limited, and must be completed by October 15. So apply to National today, register for the prep course, and launch yourself on the road to your APR.
