The PR Professional of the Year Award recognizes a Puget Sound area PR professional who has best demonstrated professionalism, innovation and involvement in the field of public relations within the past year (2017). The award is open to PRSA chapter members and non-members alike. Nominations can be submitted by any PRSA Puget Sound chapter member on behalf of another member or non-member. Self-nominations are also encouraged.

Evaluation

While heavily weighted toward a nominee's professional accomplishments, the evaluation will also consider how the individual demonstrated a commitment to integrity and ethical practice in his or her work and contributed to advancing the PR profession through community involvement or other service. The majority of a nominee's accomplishments submitted for consideration should have occurred during the past year.

Selection

A judging committee of chapter members and board members will select a winner from among the nominees. The award will be presented at the Totem Awards Celebration Event in March 2018.
